
New US distributor, Reiterate BUY

What's it all about?

Enapter announced the conclusion of an agreement with its first exclusive distribution partner (Solar Invest International SE, Luxembourg) for the US market in 2023. An amount of EUR 25m has been agreed as consideration for Enapter, of which approx. EUR 10m will be booked in 2023. This will offset the previously expected negative EBITDA of EUR -10 to -11m for FY2023, while supporting Enapter's sales strategy. Several such exclusive distribution agreements for other countries are expected to follow. These not only lead to increased sales of the company's own products, but also, as in this case, to high one-off payments. In addition, it was announced that the main shareholder (BluGreen / Sebastian Justus Schmidt) has granted Enapter a EUR 10m development loan. We confirm our BUY rating and raise our target price to EUR 22.50.

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New US distributor, Reiterate BUY

US distribution agreement. Enapter has announced that it has secured its first and exclusive distributor for the US market (Solar Invest International SE, Luxembourg). In return, Enapter will receive a payment of EUR 25m. Around EUR 10m in 2023 and the rest over the next 2 years. This should offset the expected negative EBITDA of -10m to -11m for FY2023. On the cash flow side, however, only EUR 2m will flow in 2023 and the rest over the following 14 months.

Distribution strategy. Enapter uses a distribution strategy that is a little reminiscent of the successful franchise model, whereby it enters into exclusive distribution partnerships for various countries. This not only enables Enapter to ensure sales of its products via minimum order quantities, but also, as in this case, to receive high one-off payments. It also allows Enapter to concentrate on its core competence, the development and production of AEM electrolysers.


Other News.

- 1. Enapter's main shareholder (BluGreen / Sebastian Justus Schmidt) has granted Enapter a EUR 10m development loan in line with market conditions to manage the high order backlog (EUR 30m) in a currently difficult general environment for equity financing.
- Founder and co-CEO Sebastian Justus Schmidt is stepping down for personal reasons but will continue to serve the company as a consultant.
- New major shareholders such as Morgan Stanley (3%) and Svelland Global Trading (5%) have acquired shares.
- H2 Core System GmbH (specializing in solutions for the production, storage and utilization of green hydrogen), in which Enapter has a 30% stake, is planning a reverse IPO via a non-cash capital increase of listed Marna AG against contribution in kind. The valuation of H2 Core is expected to be EUR 40m, which means that Enapter's stake, which is currently valued at EUR 1m, would then be worth around EUR 12m. This would imply a target price premium of around EUR 0.40 once the deal is closed and demonstrates Enapter's good investment sense.

Company description

Enapter produces unified electrolysis systems that can be combined into larger modules using a modular approach. The innovative Anion Exchange Membrane (AEM) electrolysis is an evolution of PEM technologies. This development is aimed at reducing material costs. Enapter has patented its AEM electrolyser, which uses an even more cost-effective process than normal AEM, is very flexible due to its uniform shape and can be produced in series.





Outlook. Enapter's business should gain momentum in 2024 and respond to the strong demand in the hydrogen market, with the sales strategy already bearing fruit. Enapter's AEM technology stands out in the electrolysis market because it is cheaper and is particularly suitable for the flexible storage of electricity using hydrogen, which is important for renewable energies in suitable climate zones. Share price & Value. Enapter's share price was able to post a significant increase last week, rising 34.5% from its low. Enapter is poised for significant revenue growth, expected to double annually until 2025, driven primarily by strong sales of multi-core systems. This trajectory should drive cost efficiencies and position the company for long-term double-digit EBITDA margins. We reiterate our BUY rating and increase our target price to EUR 22.50, based on the expected sales growth.






AEM's patented electrolysis systems



Regional sales split 2022 in % Rest of World




Cost outlook (as % of total sales)



Sales pipeline open deals (EURm)




Hydrogen area outlook

SWOT analysis

Strengths

- Lower cost technology than PEM (lower material costs)
- · No dependence on rare metals such as titanium and iridium
- Flexible units for different plant sizes
- Broad customer network
- Focus on electricity storage with hydrogen
- · Patented core IP
- Software expertise in stack interconnection
- Full vertical integration and self-sufficiency

Valuation

DCF Model

The DCF model results in a fair value of EUR 22.84 per share:

Top-line growth: We expect Enapter AG to grow revenues at a CAGR of 55.1% between 2023E and 2030E. The long-term growth rate is set at 5.0%.

ROCE. Returns on capital are developing from -4.3% in 2023E to 25.6% in 2030E.

WACC. Starting point is a historical equity beta of 1.52. Unleverering and correcting for mean reversion yields an asset beta of 1.23. Combined with a risk-free rate of 2.0% and an equity risk premium of 6.0% this yields cost of equity of 12.2%. With pre-tax cost of borrowing at 5.0%, a tax rate of 25.0% and target debt/equity of 0.5 this results in a long-term WACC of 9.4%.

FCF Yield Model

Due to the fact that companies rarely bear sufficient resemblance to peers in terms of geographical exposure, size or competitive strength and in order to adjust for the pitfalls of weak long-term visibility, an Adjusted Free Cash Flow analysis (Adjusted FCF) has been conducted.

The adjusted Free Cash Flow Yield results in a fair value between EUR -4.21 per share based on 2023E and EUR 19.81 per share on 2027E estimates.

The main driver of this model is the level of return available to a controlling investor, influenced by the cost of that investors' capital (opportunity costs) and the purchase price – in this case the enterprise value of the company. Here, the adjusted FCF yield is used as a proxy for the required return and is defined as EBITDA less minority interest, taxes and investments required to maintain existing assets (maintenance capex).

Simply put, the model assumes that investors require companies to generate a minimum return on the investor's purchase price. The required after-tax return equals the model's hurdle rate of 7.0%. Anything less suggests the stock is expensive; anything more suggests the stock is cheap. **ESG adjustments might be applicable.** A high score indicates high awareness for environmental, social or governance issues and thus might lower the overall risk an investment in the company might carry. A low score on the contrary might increase the risk of an investment and might therefore trigger a higher required hurdle rate.






Peer group analysis

A peer group or comparable company ("comps") analysis is a methodology that calculates a company's relative value — how much it should be worth based on how it compares to other similar companies. Given that **Enapter AG** differs quite significantly in terms of size, focus, financial health and growth trajectory, we regard our peer group analysis merely as a support for other valuation methods. The peer group of Enapter AG consists of the stocks displayed in the chart below. As of 3 January 2024 the median market cap of the peer group was EUR 1,032.3m, compared to EUR 244.8m for Enapter AG. In the period under review, the peer group was less profitable than Enapter AG. The expectations for sales growth are lower for the peer group than for Enapter AG.



Comparable company analysis operates under the assumption that similar companies will have similar valuation multiples. We use the following multiples: EV/EBITDA 2023, EV/EBITDA 2024, EV/Sales 2023, EV/Sales 2024, P/BV 2023 and P/BV 2024. Applying these to Enapter AG results in a range of fair values from EUR 3.31 to EUR 1,665.34.

The following is a detailed description of the peer group (source: Sentieo):

Nel ASA, formerly Diagenic ASA, is a Norway-based hydrogen company that delivers solutions to produce, store and distribute hydrogen from renewable energy. The Company's hydrogen solutions cover the entire value chain from hydrogen production technologies to hydrogen fueling stations. Nel ASA's operations are divided into two operating segments, Nel Hydrogen Fueling and Nel Hydrogen Electrolyser. The Nel Hydrogen Fueling Segment is a manufacturer of hydrogen fueling stations that provide Fuel Cell Electric Vehicles (FCEVs) with the same fast fueling and long range as conventional fossil fuel vehicles, while the Nel Hydrogen Electrolyser Segment is a global supplier of hydrogen production equipment and plants based on both alkaline and Polymer Electrolyte Membrane (PEM) water electrolyser technology. The Company has several subsidiaries, including Proton Energy Systems Inc, Nel Hydrogen Electrolyser AS and Nel Korea Co Ltd.

ITM Power plc is an energy storage and clean fuel company. The Company manufactures integrated hydrogen energy solutions for grid balancing, energy storage and the production of renewable hydrogen for transport, renewable heat and chemicals. Its proton exchange membrane (PEM) electrolysers use renewable electricity and water to create green hydrogen through a process called electrolysis. Its electrolysers include HGAS1SP, HGAS3SP and 3MEP CUBE. HGAS1SP is a small containerized PEM electrolyser system and its Plug & Play product includes a single ITM Power PEM electrolyser stack alongside all the necessary sub-systems required to produce self-pressurized green hydrogen gas. HGAS3SP is a medium-sized containerized PEM electrolyser system, and its Plug & Play product includes three ITM Power PEM electrolyser stacks alongside all the necessary sub-systems





required to produce self-pressurized green hydrogen gas. 3MEP CUBE is a modular system for large hydrogen production.

Plug Power Inc. is a provider of hydrogen fuel cell turnkey solutions. The Company provide electrolyzers that allow customers, such as refineries, producers of chemicals, steel, fertilizer and commercial refueling stations, to generate hydrogen on-site. It focuses on industrial mobility applications, including electric forklifts and electric industrial vehicles, at multi-shift high volume manufacturing and high throughput distribution sites and environmental benefits; stationary power systems that supports critical operations, such as data centers, microgrids and generation facilities, in either a backup power or continuous power role and replace batteries, diesel generators or the grid for telecommunication logistics, transportation, and utility customers; and production of hydrogen. Its products include GenDrive, GenFuel, GenCare, GenSure, GenKey, ProGen, Electrolyzers, Liquefaction Systems and Cryogenic Equipment. It serves the North American and European material handling markets.

Powercell Sweden AB (publ) is a Sweden-based company active in the field of clean energy. It is engaged in the development, manufacture and sales of power systems with fuel cell and reformer technology. Its systems work both fossil and renewable fuels and convert them to hydrogen, which drives the power cells. The Company's product offering comprises: Fuel Cell Stack, designed to work in the auxiliary power unit (APU) environment on reformate gas or hydrogen and varying from one to six kilowatts (kW); and PowerPac, a complete electric power-generating unit operating in the range between one and three kW, which uses low sulfur road diesel. The possible applications of its products include telecommunication, transport, power supply to buildings, and military.

Thyssenkrupp nucera is an environmental technology company for electrolysis systems. The company focuses on the development, production, project management and maintenance of systems for the production of hydrogen by the chlor-alkali process for industrial use and by alkaline hydrogen electrolysis for the supply of green energy. 




Risk

The chart displays the distribution of daily returns of Enapter AG over the last 3 years, compared to the same distribution for Nel ASA. We have also included the distribution for the index DAX. The distribution gives a better understanding of risk than measures like volatility, which assume that log returns are normally distributed. In reality, they are skewed (down moves are larger) and have fat tails (large moves occur more often than predicted). Also, volatility treats up and down moves the same, while investors are more worried about down moves. For Enapter AG, the worst day during the past 3 years was 09/12/2022 with a share price decline of -20.0%. The best day was 13/01/2021 when the share price increased by 14.8%.

Risk - Daily Returns Distribution (trailing 3 years)





